

Session 8: Where Do We Go From Here?

Big Idea

So where do we go from here? In this final session, we will be discussing the grand overview of parental, marital, and family goals. Parents have to be role models. Your children need to look and see someone they can esteem and respect in the home, as well as other areas of society. You will discover that your calendar and time management will have a great influence on your family. Finally, you will find that being the priest of your home is necessary in leading your family well.
