DAY 1

Read Luke 2:52

This month is all about wisdom which is finding out what you should do and doing it! Wisdom is needed anytime you have a choice to make with real consequences. Choices like...

- Should I play soccer this year?
- Should I invite the new kid to my birthday party?
- Should I spend 20 more minutes studying?

Every day, as you're growing physically, you also have the opportunity to grow in wisdom. As today's verse reminds us, the same was true of Jesus. Jesus not only grew physically but He grew mentally, too! Jesus understood that wisdom was worth searching for.

Growth Chart

DAY 2

Read James 1:5

When we look at the life of Jesus, how He treated people, what He said, and the way that He lived, we find wisdom at every turn. Jesus showed us how to live wisely. When we follow Jesus’ example, it’s like building a house on a strong foundation.
