### Get to Know You (10 Minutes)

## **Observation & Discussion (30 Minutes)**

**James 1:1** — James, a servant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ, To the twelve tribes scattered among the nations: Greetings.

James started out as a skeptic then became a servant

**James 1:2-4** - <sup>2</sup> Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, <sup>3</sup> because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. <sup>4</sup> Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything.

- 1. Are you more of a skeptic or a servant naturally?
- 2. Trust the Process: Have you experienced a time in your life when you had to trust the process instead of trying to control the outcome?
- 3. Why is it hard to trust God when in the midst of trials or pain?

**James 1:22-25** — <sup>22</sup> Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. <sup>23</sup> Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror <sup>24</sup> and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. <sup>25</sup> But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it—not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it—they will be blessed in what they do.

- 4. Be a doer: Don't just listen and hear, but do what it says. Share 1 or 2 ways you could more actively **do** or live out your faith in God.
- 5. Consider the audience James is reaching. Have you tried to live out your values but run into external hurdles?
